## **Our Learning**





The children have been joining in sharing pretend food with one another for their own Tea Party. They were naming all of the different foods and sitting with one another pretending to eat these.

The adult supported the children in talking about foods that are unhealthy and healthy.





The children have been busy with large scale mark making on the floor. With some children talking to the adults about the different marks they have made.

#### Wildlife

The children have been very interested in looking at wildlife from their classroom window. They have been amused watching the squirrels run up and down the tree and even put out some of their snack to share with them!



## **Books and Literacy**



The children have also been learning how to hold and turn the pages of a book to follow along with the story. Some of the children have been noticing the print in these books and pointing out familiar letters that appear in their name.







## Investigations and Team Work

The children have been creating their very own marble runs. They worked together sharing ideas, they then connected pieces of guttering and used different shaped blocks to raise these of the floor.

They took it in turns to run marbles and cars down their structure waiting to watch as they appeared at the end of their structure.





### **Making Enclosures**

The children used a whole range of blocks to create different structures.

This initially stared with them building a home and bed for another child's special toy from home.

They then worked together to build towers and homes for other different animals.
