Transferring and Mixing




The children have been busy transferring and emptying with oats and containers. They listened to the sounds of the oats falling into the metal containers using both their hands and different utensils to move the oats around.

The children spent a long time engaged in this learning experience and experimented further with textures by adding water.


Our outdoor den and library

The children were excited to explore in their outdoor den which we created using different fabrics. They choose a selection of books which they looked at turning the pages and lifting the flaps.



Working Together..

The children used Duplo to create their own farm houses, they connected pieces together and used the different Duplo animals to add to their structures. The children joined in with some different farm and jungle nursery rhymes during this.



Beech Class

Artistic play and learning



In Beech class the children have been mark making and painting in a range of different ways. They created their own easels by hanging paper onto the garden fence and then creating their designs using colours which they had mixed and created in paint palettes.



Hurry, Hurry put the fire out!



Outside the children created their very own fire station and fire. They used helmets and vests during their imaginative play to each pretend to be fire fighters.

They worked out how to support one another with jugs and water and filled up their hoses with water. They then lifted these into the air and watched as the water poured out on the pretend fire.



A dental nurse visit

We were lucky to have a visit from a dental health nurse. She spent some time supporting the children with their understanding about keeping their teeth healthy, looking at how to brush teeth and what types of foods are good for our teeth. The children then got time to explore in their very own dentist practice!



A small group of children spent a long time working together with different construction resources to make a home for the dinosaurs. They tested their ideas and figured out what sized shape cylinders they needed to balance the dinosaur home.
