Oak Class



Early Investigations





The children have been exploring with a range of natural resources. They have been playing and exploring whilst testing out their ideas. They spent long periods of time attempting to push a spoon handle through the top of a loofah. They also explored with the different soft and hard textures. They also tested out the different sounds that could be made when items were dropped into containers and tins.

Ready, steady, go...

The children were fascinated by a throwing game in Oak Class. They took it in turns to each try to throw the small balls up into the air and through the hanging hoop. The children cheered for one another and laughed with excitement as the balls were being thrown.





5,4,3,2 and 1



The children have been exploring with balance and height. They have been working together in small groups to build tall towers using the large plastic blocks. Only once all of the blocks have been stacked on top of each other will they then get ready by counting down from 5,4,3,2,1 and knocking over the tower with excitement.







The children have been focusing intently whilst developing their fine motor control. Using pipe cleaners and colanders they spent a long time focused on pushing the pipe cleaners through the holes to create their own creative pieces.

Beech Class



Creative and Critical Thinking..



In Beech Class the children have been spending long periods of time together putting the pieces together in different ways to make a marble run.



They have shared and listened to one another's ideas as well as working out what did and did not work. They were keen to make the marbles travel as fast as they could so wanted to make their marble run the tallest.



My name and yours...



The children have been showing lots of interest in print whether that is in their environment, in books or from their names. They have spent long periods of time exploring with magnetic letters practicing their phonological awareness.



The children have also been on a letter search finding the letters that make up theirs and their peers' names before attempting to write these on large pieces of paper.



Wobbling jellyfish

The children were inspired by another child's art work from home. Using paper plates, glue, tissue paper, pens, pipe cleaners and googly eyes they spent long periods of time engaged in making their very own jellyfish.



Every child had their own set of ideas and found the resources they needed to make their jellyfish of different sizes and colours.



As many of the children currently in Beech Class will be transitioning into Reception in September 2025. We are encouraging parents to drop their children at the entrance door to Beech Class to support your child with their independence.



The children have been playing a variety of outdoor games with one another whilst negotiating and taking turns.
