

A bit lost...

The children have been focusing on the Chris Houghton story **A Bit Lost**. They used puppets and made their very own tree with a cardboard tube and leaves to retell the story of the lost owl.

Some of the children recalled events from the story, 'Bump, Bump, Bump' and 'Mummy sad'.



Listening Games and 'What's that sound?'

The children have been showing a high level of interest when playing listening games and '**Guess what's in the bag?**'

They have listened to different animal and environmental sounds taking it in turns to guess what the sound might be. The children were very excited to hear fireworks, different sirens, wild animals and even guessed correctly when they could hear the rain.



Outdoors...

The children have been outdoors and looking out of the door at night time to explore the snow and cold temperatures.

They called out for the birds in the evening and said, '*Sleeping'* when it was quiet.

The children explored outside when it began to snow and tried to catch the snow in their hands.





Bonfire night

The children have been looking at the story of 'Guy Fawkes' as we celebrated bonfire night. The children spoke about the fireworks that they had seen either through the windows at home or at a firework display. The children recreated what they saw using paint and glitter. The children also learnt the words to the bonfire night song which they have really enjoyed, 'On bonfire night at fire a clock....'



London Bridge



The children have shown a keen interest in structures and buildings from around the world. Following on from singing the 'London Bridge' nursery rhyme the children used the I-Pad to see the famous bridge opening and closing. They then made their very own bridges using Lego and a photo for reference.

Baking week

The children got involved with decorating cakes during baking week. We even had help from one of the children's parents.

Thank you to everybody that donated cakes, baked at home and made a purchase from the cake stand.



Let it snow.....



With the temperatures dropping, the children have been exploring with ice. They were fortunate enough to explore outside when we had 10 minutes of snow!

This led to some interesting experiments with children leaving water out overnight to see if it would freeze. They also spoke about the snow melting as it hit their hands and why this happens. Inside the children spent a long time working together to free the toys from the ice.
