Cedar Class



The children have been looking at all things symmetrical. After investigating in the garden and indoor environments they then used mirrors to look at their faces, using their hands as a centre line to see the symmetry.

Using the IPad we looked more closely at the pattern of a butterfly before recreating these by making butterfly paintings. These are displayed in the hall way so please do have a look.







Outside in the garden children have been working on their balance and co-ordination skills. The stilts have been practised daily with some of the children now mastering the art of walking with them. We have been practising balancing on one leg and jumping from one foot to the other whilst shifting our body weight.

Healthy Choices

This month we have been looking at the different ways to keep ourselves healthy. From exercising, getting enough sleep and drinking plenty of water to the types of food that we eat. The children have been confident in making healthy choices. They also looked closely at the effect that exercise has on their bodies.

What can you find?



Oak Class






Oak class have been interested in exploring with the wild animals. To further build on the childrens' curiosity, they were shown habitats of some of the wild animals, where we spoke about, Polar Bears living in cold climates and that Elephants live in hot countries such as Africa and India. The children were then given the opportunity to draw their own "houses" for the animal of choice.



Some of the children have been busy in the mud kitchen where they used spoons, spatulas, pots, pans and baking trays to make "Muddy soup".

The children each had their own aims and objectives when creating their muddy soups. The children added water to the soil and watched the consistency of the soil change.



Once finished they will cheer and clap with delight before seeking out others to join their circle game.



Easter Nests

In celebration of Easter, Oak Class showed delight in making some yummy Easter treats. The children each had their own bowls where they mixed together melted chocolate and cereal to make Easter nests. Oak class show good control when using the utensils to mix the ingredients together and good hand eye co-ordination when the mixture was transferred into cupcake cases.
