The children have been experimenting with different ways of moving and also learning about the effects that exercise and movement has on their bodies.


## **Fun Outdoor Games**

The children have been taking part in games and have especially enjoyed one named hot lava. The idea of the game is to make your way through a string obstacle course and if the string touches you, you need to go back to the beginning of the course and try again.

Conversations from this game about lava have also sparked the childrens' interests in volcanoes. We are therefore going to be looking at making our own pretend hot lava with bicarbonate of soda and vinegar.



The children have been learning new weekly Makaton signs. Last week during their morning circle times they practiced 'Good Morning'. Why not continue this at home? Please keep a look out on the Cedar Class door for our weekly signs.





The children have been busy practicing writing their own names and those of others on their artwork.



### **Learning Outdoors**

Oak Class have been showing an interest in mini beasts. The children have been doing hunting for mini beasts in the bark area where they were supported in turning logs over to search for worms, snails and slugs.
