### Bake off week......

For our bake sale week the children in Cedar were very busy in the kitchen. The children helped to make lots of yummy treats to sell including cakes, biscuits and bread. They then became shop keepers and helped to sell. They greeted, handled money and made sure to tell customers to "have a nice day!"





The children have been learning some basic first aid. Some resuscitation equipment was kindly donated to us from a parent and we have used this in learning about our body and respiratory system. They named the mannequin Johnny and practised using the masks and giving CPR. We spoke about what number to call in an emergency. Later on that week the children examined the contents of the first aid kit, going through what each item is used for and making predictions of what scenarios we may need to use the items in.

The scooter boards have been very popular again this month. The children have found that if they use them next to the main garden door, there is a slight hill, meaning that they can move very quickly. Once they have lined themselves up they will race to see who can move the quickest

### Let's Bake

The children showed a huge delight during bake sale week making biscuits, cupcakes and banana bread which one of Oak class' parents kindly came in to help bake. The children used simple mathematical language such as "more", "less", "add" and "how many".

### **Sensory Exploration...**

Oak class explored cooked rice. The children were given bowls containing red food colouring and were encouraged to mix the rice and the food colouring together. The children were encouraged to make predications on what they thought might happen. The children mixed, poured and did good turn taking throughout this sensory activity and showed joy in watching the rice change colour and were keen to discuss what they had witness "look, its red now."
