The children joined in with the nursery rhyme 'Old Mcdonald' and also repeated the different animal names and sounds.






Imaginative Play

The children used rope, string, tape, bamboo tubes and A frames to make their own den and climbing structure. They spent up to 1 hour working on this together and connected it to the side of the climbing frame outdoors.

The children spoke about lengths and heights and found more resources to add to their structure. Afterwards the children also covered it with a large piece of fabric.

The children all sat together on the carpet with a basket full of different building blocks. They took it in turns to place a block onto a piece of paper. After 3 turns each of placing a block onto the paper the children had worked together to stack, balance and lay their blocks flat onto one another to create what they called a cit. They children were all very proud of what they had achieved together and spoke about being a team.

The children made their very own tyre swing. We worked together for some time and problem solved with how to throw our rope over the tree branch.

The children then helped to lift the tyre and hold this onto a chair whilst we secured the rope around it. They each then took it in turns to stand on the tyre swing or lay inside of it as they pushed one another back and forth.
